- All light tubes/bulbs (If broken, carefully wrap it in paper.)
- O Dry cell batteries: Nickel-cadmium batteries should be separeted from manganese, alkaline, and lithium batteries.
- O Paper beverage cartons with recycling symbol (Rinse and flatten cartons)
- O Waste cooking oil (Please put waste cooking oil into waste oil collection drum cans.)
- *Take your garbage to the designated collecting places on collection days by 8:30 a.m. All trash must be placed in designated trash bags or have a designated garbage sticker on it.
